Mr. Gausch reported that the Bunny Breakfast and Egg Hunt were scheduled on 3/23/15.

# B) Pennwyn Playground - grant from Center for Watershed Protection

Ms. Johnston informed the Board that, in the fall of 2014, the Township authorized the Center for Watershed Protection to feature Pennwyn Playground in a training workshop. The site was deemed to be well-suited for installation of storm water best management practices. The Center then awarded a grant up to \$20,000 for such installations. The goals of the grant are to reduce impervious surface, create rain gardens, and to redirect runoff, in order to reduce sediment from storm water for the Wyomissing Creek in compliance with the MS4 program.

## C) Gouglersville Playground – grant application to PA American

Mr. Gausch informed the Board that the Gouglersville Fire Company had authorized the Wyomissing Creek Watershed Coalition, of which Cumru is a member, to submit the grant application to PA American for the fire company playground. Part of the grant application, if approved, would involve in-kind services by the Township to install a rain garden. Because two fire company members with construction experience need community service hours, it is possible that the Township's participation will be significantly reduced.

The Board concurred with accepting the Pennwyn Playground grant and authorizing application for the Gouglersville Playground grant.

## E) Montrose Playground – MAYBA request to place shed

Mr. Gausch informed the Board that MAYBA desired to place a small equipment shed in a corner of Montrose Manor Playground. The Park and Recreation Board generally concurred with the request, conditioned upon an agreement being developed by the Solicitor and reimbursement by MAYBA of any legal costs. MAYBA recently made a commitment to pay legal costs associated with such an agreement. Mr. Setley described the appropriate agreement as an irrevocable license agreement. MAYBA would have to provide a certificate of insurance naming the Township as an additional insured. Mrs. Hoover stated that the base should be stone, not concrete.

Mr. McNichols informed the Board that significant frost heave had been observed. Numerous pot holes were being addressed with cold patch. Hot patch was not yet available.

## C) SR 724 Bridge over Angelica Creek - sidewalk

Ms. Johnston informed the Board that if the Township desires sidewalk on the SR 724 bridge over the Angelica Creek, the Township would have to maintain it. Mr. McNichols pointed out that there is nowhere in the area to pull over for maintenance. Ms. Johnston noted that the sidewalk would actually be within the municipal boundaries of Kenhorst Borough. The Board concurred that the question of sidewalk on the SR 724 bridge should be deferred to Kenhorst Borough, as the sidewalk would be in that municipality. Cumru would not participate in maintenance, if it is installed.
